

### WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

The Queensland Chamber of Agriculture Associations Inc hold each exhibitor responsible to discharge Its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor/competitor of any area of the affiliated Agricultural Associations Showgrounds/Precinct.

Each exhibitor/competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, volunteers, family, other exhibitors, Agricultural Society staff, show visitors, children and any person foreseeably affected by the presentation of their exhibit.

Exhibits will only be held and handled by competent persons whose experience Is known to the Exhibitor/competitor.

The exhibitors/competitors are advised that the use of Primus Stoves, any heating or lighting appliances of a likecharacter, or any naked light, ls strictly prohibited in Pavilions/stables/barns.

Any exhibitors/competitors Intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds/Precinct will be required to ensure that such equipment Is fitted with a residual current protection and that all electrical lead s, tools and appliances have been Inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and are currently tagged. The use of double adaptors is prohibited, and all power boards must also be tested and tagged.

All exhibitors/competitors will comply with the requirements of the ACT end Its Regulations and Standards In every respect. This Is essential for the safety of all exhibitors/competitors and the general public. The ACT Imposes very severe penalties in the event of noncompliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors/competitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at "Queensland Chamber of Agriculture Association. affiliated Shows".

# Section 21, Fine Art - Competition Details

# Framework.

This competition is open to everybody, from primary school preppers to enthusiastic adult beginners and accomplished artists.

It is a good opportunity for first-time contestants to experience the nitty-gritty of such events. All it takes is the confidence to enter artwork for assessment by an experienced judge for the official awards, then to have it on public display over the three days of the show and consequently, in-the-running for one of the six Peoples' Choice awards.

There are many facets to its structure, most relate to the contestants, others are tailored to engage show-patrons in a Fine Art appreciation experience. Whetting their appetites for more art exhibitions which may encourage them to pick up a pencil and 'have a go' themselves.

The Fine Art section has a prime location in the Main Pavilion and a reasonable though limited allocation of floorspace. Consequently, sensible limits for the size of works have been set to maximise the number of hangings.

Volunteers who set-up the exhibition and interact with show patrons, are members of the Bundaberg Art Society with the appropriate level of knowledge to ensure everyone enjoys the experience on offer.

This is a unique competition for the times because it is not run along commercial lines which require all entries to be offered for sale. It is however, limited to 2D works which adhere to traditional drawing/painting mediums and their traditional support surfaces

Sponsors are sought from Community Leaders who have access to public funds earmarked for the arts and from local businesses that supply and service the needs of artists. Total prize pool is 1710

# **Conditions of Entry**

# 1. Entrant's Responsibilities, Classes 1 to 5

- a. Artwork must be the signed original work of the entrant, completed since 1st June 2024
- b. A limit of two entries per class applies.
- c. Framed work has a size limit of 60cm x 40cm (A3 size artwork, plus matting plus frame) or 40cm x 40cm for square framed works.
- d. Unframed works on canvas or board is limited to 60cm x 45cm
- e. To facilitate hanging, braided cord or wire is to be securely tied to 'D' Hooks located 6cm from top of frames, canvas or boards
- f. Entrant's name, address, phone number and title of works to be clearly marked or glued/taped to back of works.
- g. All reasonable care will be taken with works once they have been accepted by the Show Society, but the Society will not accept any liability for loss or damage while in their care. Insurance is the responsibility of the Artist.

# 2. Entrant's Acknowledgements, Classes 1 to 5.

- a. The Show Society reserves the right not to hang any work considered unsuitable for public viewing. Such works will not be judged; there will be no discussion entered into nor Entry Fee refunded.
- b. All accepted works will be judged.
- c. The Show Society reserves the right to have any entry reproduced for publicity in the press, on-line social media or on television, without liability for any form of remuneration to the exhibitor.
- d. All works, including those which have been sold, must remain on exhibition over the three Show Days and collected between 9am and noon on Saturday 1st June 2023.
- e. Prize Money is to be collected from the Show Society Office from 2pm Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> May until 2pm, Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> June 2024.
- f. Gift Voucher Prizes may be collected any time from the Duty Steward on Show Days or by 2pm on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> June 2024.
- g. All Sales Transactions will be supervised be the Chief Steward on a no fee no commission cash only basis. NB eftpos facility is not available.

# 3. Entrants Responsibilities, Primary Schools - Classes 6 & 7

- a Artworks should be undertaken as a private project, not a school classroom project; Preppers would be the only allowable exception.
- b Size of all works, whether on paper, canvas or board, framed or unframed, is limited to 30cm x 21cm (A4). Paintings and drawings on paper must be fixed to a rigid backing to prevent curling and to facilitate hanging.
- c Pupil's name, grade, title of work and name of school (or school stamp) to be recorded on back of artwork.
- d To comply with Court Orders for Child Protection matters, schools may bulk list entries, showing first name and first letter of family name only, on a single Entry Form for each class (6 or 7 and disregard the provisions of 3c above. Relative artworks will only be identified by the allocated entry number, not the artist.
- e Where circumstances allow, parents may choose to disregard the 3d protocol and lodge their entry in line with 3c above.

# 4. Deadlines, all Classes 1 to 7

- a. Entries close 4pm Monday 20th May 2024. No Late Entries will be accepted.
- b. Exhibits to be delivered to the Main Pavilion Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> May, between 9am and noon
- c. Exhibits to be collected the following Saturday 1st June between 9am and noon
- d. Prize money to be collected from the Show Office during the Show from 2.00 pm Wed 29th May until 2:00pm Sat 1st June 2024. After the show all prize money not collected will be returned to the Society's Funds.

# **Classes**

There are seven Classes (show-speak for 'categories'), each one targets the range of talents within the demographics mentioned above.

All artwork is to be 2D (two dimensional only) using traditional wet or dry mediums; -

- watercolours, oils, acrylics, or inks.
- graphite, charcoal, coloured pencils, pastels or pen and ink with (optional) watercolour washes or lino prints.

# **OPEN**

- 21/1 Australian Landscape/Seascape: Any medium, wet, or dry on paper, canvas, or board.

  Sponsored by Stephen Bennett MP for Burnett.
- **21/2 Australian Flora/fauna:** Any medium, wet, or dry on paper, canvas, or board include introduced species such as farm animals and domestic pets.
  - Sponsored by Tom Smith MP for Bundaberg
- **Painting:** Any subject including abstract, on paper, canvas, or board. Using wet mediums; watercolours, oils, acrylics, or inks.
  - **21/4 Drawing:** Any subject on paper or scratchboard. Using graphite, charcoal, coloured pencils, pastels or pen and ink with (optional) watercolour washes or lino prints.

# HIGH SCHOOL

**21/5 Junior open:** Any subject including abstract using traditional wet or dry mediums on paper, canvas, or board. Open to all high school students or other teenagers aged to 18.
